



WHO WE ARE & WHAT WE DO

Metro East Park and Recreation District's primary role is to partner with other public entities throughout Madison and St. Clair Counties in Illinois for the purposes of improving parks, developing trails, and expanding recreational opportunities for the public's enjoyment. Secondarily, Metro East Park and Recreation District strives to increase awareness, usage, and appreciation of those assets owned and operated by its partners.

The Metro East Park and Recreation District (MEPRD) was created following the passage of Illinois HB 702 in July 1999, and the subsequent approval of "Proposition C: The Clean Water, Safe Parks, and Community Trails Initiative" by the voters in Madison and St. Clair Counties in November 2000.

The Metro East Park and Recreation Act authorizes the District to impose a onetenth (1/10) percent sales tax within its jurisdiction, of which amount MEPRD receives 50% to advance the District's mission. The remaining 50% is distributed back to each respective county for park, trail, and recreation-related purposes.

MEPRD partners with and supplements the efforts of other public agencies, as well as 501(c)3 nonprofit organizations, already engaged in the development, operation, and maintenance of public parks, trails, and recreation facilities within the two Counties.

METRO EAST PARK AND RECREATION DISTRICT ACT

70 ILCS 1605/ et seq.

Metro East Park and Recreation District was established by a referendum initiated and approved by the voters of St. Clair County and Madison County, Illinois in 2000, and is governed by the **Metro East Park and Recreation District Act**, 70 ILCS 1605/ *et seq*.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

MEPRD is currently governed by a board of six members, three from each county comprising the district. Pursuant to the Metro East Park and Recreation District Act, the Chief Executive Officer of each county, with the advice and consent of the county board, appoints two of the three members. The third member is then appointed by the minority members of the respective county board.



FINDINGS

The Committee found no inefficiencies of Metro East Park and Recreation District to report. Throughout its 23-year history, MEPRD has consistently strived to maximize the impact and reach of the MEPRD tax revenue.



5 EFFICIENCY COMMITTEE D RECOMMENDATIONS

Upon a thorough review by the Metro East Park and Recreation District Decennial Committee on Local Government Efficiency, it was recommended that Metro East Park and Recreation District continue operating as it is and as it has been since the inception of the organization.
